### ESP Update 2014/9

December 18, 2014

#### Dear ESP members and friends,

Another year is nearing its end. For ESP it was a busy, but successful year; with a well-attended and appreciated 7<sup>th</sup> ESP Conference (see below) and a growing membership, both in terms of paying members (+20%) and Friends (almost doubled to more than 2000 account-holders). In 2014 we also saw the election and start of the Steering Committee. We are currently busy inviting people to the ESP Advisory Board to strengthen the ties with the main international organisations on the science, policy and practice of ecosystem services.

We thank all of you for the various contributions you have made to ESP and look forward to 2015!

## 1. 8<sup>th</sup> ESP Conference in South Africa, 9-13 November 2015

We are pleased to announce that the next ESP conference will be held in a very special location: Spier Wine farm and Conference Centre in Stellenbosch, near

Initially also ICRAF had proposed Tanzania, near the Ngorongoro crater as a possible venue but due to financial constraints they withdrew their offer. More news will follow soon so keep an eye on the ESP website but mark these dates and spread the word! We already have an informal agreement with GIZ to again organise a pre- or post-conference Training on Values which was very well received in Costa Rica.

#### 2. Outcomes of the ESP7 conference survey

In total 80 respondents, or almost 25% of all participants of the 7<sup>th</sup> ESP Conference completed the survey. The conference overall was rated with a 4.1 (on a 1-5 scale). Most appreciated was the opportunity to get together with the ESP Working Groups (4.28), and the pre-conference trainings (4.24). The facilitation of the Poster session needs improvement (3.4) and many people found the keynotes not challenging enough, and not always linked to the conference Theme (3.63). #### 3. ESP Governance

- To ensure proper attention to important issues, and divide the workload, four special **Issue Committees** have been created (on funding, international relations, membership engagement and the international conference), consisting of members from both the Executive Committee and Steering Committee.
- To further strengthen strategic collaborations and partnerships, so that ESP can be even more effective at achieving its goals, we are in the process of establishing the ESP Advisory Board to provide support and strategic guidance on the relevance and effectiveness of our activities.

### 4. Working Groups

- Following ESP7, several WGs are preparing Special Issues, among others on "Integrated valuation of ecosystem services: challenges and solutions", managing guest editor: Sander Jacobs. Submission deadline: April, 1st 2015. When you submit your article and be sure to select "SI: Integrated Valuation"
- Several new Working Groups and Task Forces have also been proposed (more news on that in the next Update)

- With the growing number of working groups it is necessary to harmonise the description of the Working group webpages on the ESP website. Therefore an email was sent to the more than 160 WG Lead teams to discuss the webpages content. In addition, we are investigating how we can better facilitate discussions and sharing of documents by improving the interactive aspects of the ESP website.

### 5. Outcomes of the general ESP survey

A survey was held amongst ESP members and friends in August and the results were presented at the 7<sup>th</sup> annual ESP conference in September. The survey gave us a good impression of the expectations and concerns, as well as the profile of ESP'ers. ESP is a young community, the average age of the ESP'er is 39 years old and has been working on ES on average for 6.4 years. The majority of ESP'ers work on the science aspect of ES, this is also reflected in the fact the 50% work at universities.
